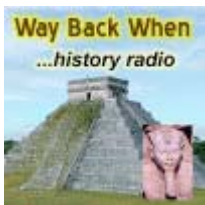
Yuma Territorial Prison Chain Gang Program goes national

Local fundraising organizers featured on national radio program

The interest in the saving of the Yuma Territorial Prison has now reached a national audience. Big Blend Magazine featured the Yuma Territorial Prison Chain Gang program during a 30 minute live on-air interview Friday, Feb. 5th with City Historian Tina Clark and Event Coordinator Susan Sternitzke.
